
everything about SJC, Prayagraj was topnotch. We made up our








































































Christmas The Festival of Joy & Love

One of the most prestigious competitions was Medha Pratiyogita organized by the NTPC in which hundreds of





AMBITIONS FOR FUTURE

"Space is one of the few fields where India has owned the recognition it deserves."

With time, the Indian Space Programme has proved the importance of Space Technology for the common man. In this article, we look at the expected missions ISRO has got planned for the coming era, and how we are different from other well-known space agencies across the Globe.

1. Gaganyaan : This Mission was originally planned to take place this year on the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav. Unfortunately, the date was delayed due to reasons caused by the pandemic. Its final launch would take place, after a series of unmanned trials in the year 2024, If we are successful, this is going to be a historic achievement for us

as India will become the fourth nation to send humans to space on its own (after the US, Russia and China). When I say on its own, I do mean it. We have got everything prepared indigenously—from the Launch vehicle to Crew Module. We are only relying on other countries for spacesuits and training of "Vyomanauts". ISRO has no experience in sending humans to space, so Gaganyaan is indeed going to be challenging. I believe that if ISRO further postpones the launch date, it is reasonable. After all, it is a matter of human lives.

2. Aditya L1: This is a planned Coronagraphy
Spacecraft aimed at scientific research on the Sun's atmosphere. It would mainly study solar magnetic storms, which can have a great, disastrous impact on the Earth. It is to be placed as a comprehensive solar and space environment observatory at the Lagrange point L1 in a halo orbit between Earth and Sun. Aditya L1 is to be launched by the first guarter of 2023.

3. Shukrayaan-1: Motivated by the success of interplanetary missions Chandrayaan and Mangalyaan, ISRO is planning to launch a mission to the Earth's twin, Venus, by 2025. It would study the surface and atmosphere of Venus. An interesting aspect of this mission is that ISRO is going to do the same job as NASA would do in 2028-29 at one-tenth of NASA's cost.

4. Chandrayaan-3: This is another attempt by ISRO to send a rover after the failure of Chandrayaan-2 to do the same. By the way, Chandrayaan-2 should not be seen as a complete failure. Chandrayaan-3 would be a re-attempt to demonstrate our landing capabilities needed for the Lunar Polar Exploration Mission, proposed in partnership with Japan in 2024.

5. ISRO's Space Station: The most ambitious among all these programmes is to set up a space station of our own! No, we are not going that far. Building a space station like the ISS (International Space Station) will require a lot of capital

investment. So we are going to have a small one—small module aimed to carry out microgravity experiments. It can be thought of as an extension of the Gaganyaan mission. It will be fixed in a 400-kilometre orbit (Low Earth Orbit), where astronauts might stay for up to 15-20 days. ISRO does not want to contribute to the ISS, rather it aims to have a separate space station. This project certainly requires time and is expected to take place after 2030.

Where are we?

Many people tend to compare ISRO to NASA. But we need to understand a few things. A

major factor is the budget. When we consider the budget allotted to NASA by the American Government, it becomes apparent how NASA can launch so many missions as if they were a cakewalk. NASA has a far better infrastructure and technology than ISRO. Nevertheless, we are better than NASA when it comes to efficiency, resourcefulness, and cost-effectiveness. ISRO does several similar missions at a fraction of other space agencies' costs. If the budget of the Department of Space is increased by the Government of India, ISRO will get a lot more opportunities to carry out more such missions and to expand the scope of space technology. "This is not the era of Competition, this is the era of Collaboration. Countries need to come together for Humanity to progress in its truest sense."






Modern world is incomplete without internet. We use it in our daily life. But as we can access everything on it, people out there can also use it as a medium to get into our personal life.

WISH I WERE MY BLUE KITE



Cuckoo or Myna? A captivating sweet, Melody filled the golden farms down the hill. And I felt at the lap of my mother!


But the sweet song abruptly ended


